MARINE INDUSTRY TRAINING REQUIREMENTS SURVEY

The 2015-2016 training requirements survey exercise was completed in at the end of October, when the last forms were received. After the results were compiled, a recommended breakdown of the funding available for marine-sector businesses for regulated training was forwarded to Emploi-Québec.

By mid-november, organizations that are eligible for funding will receive a letter from the IMQ (Centre de Saint-Romuald) explaining the procedure to follow in order to benefit from funded availabilities. Based on training requests that could not be granted in the first round, the Sectorial Committee will make a reserve list for each type of regulated training. The list will be used to fill the availabilities not used to avoid losing the available funding.

Non-regulated training

While analyzing the survey results, we also paid careful attention to compiling needs for and interest in non-regulated training. This category covers training in seamanship, safety and security, the environment, human resources management and others. In the coming weeks, we will analyze these requests in greater detail to ensure that the training currently offered appropriately meets your requirements.
