MARINE INDUSTRY TRAINING NEEDS SURVEY UNDER WAY!

On September 18, all Sectorial Committee member organizations received an e-mail invitation to complete **the 2015-2016 training needs survey**. The deadline for returning the completed form is Friday, October 9, 2015.

As you know, CSMOIM'S mandate involves being aware of skills and training requirements. The annual survey allows us to draw up a list of Québec maritime organizations' needs and to meet them.

Your participation is essential. In addition to helping us tailor the training we offer to meet members' needs, survey results are important for regulated training financial assistance allocation. Again this year, only survey respondents will be eligible for financial assistance.

QUÉBEC MARITIME STRATEGY: A NEW SEAFARER PROGRAM...AND CONFIRMED RESOURCES FOR MARINE-SECTOR TRAINING

On June 29, Premier of Quebec, Philippe Couillard, and Minister of Transport and the Implementation of the Maritime Strategy, Jean D'Amour, released the Quebec Maritime Strategy along with many of their National Assembly colleagues.

Among the numerous measures announced is the creation of a brand-new study program (Secondary School Vocational Diploma) to train seafarers for the marine labour market. In setting up this program, the Québec government is responding favourably to a proposal the Sectorial Committee made more than a year ago. This is excellent news for marine-sector training in Québec. Furthermore, through the Strategy, Québec has also committed to investing \$15 million in marine-sector training over the next five years.

Work on developing the new seafarer program, which will cover both deck rating and engine rating, is under way. Québec's education department has already designated its program development specialists and the Institut maritime professors invited to collaborate. In the coming months, the Sectorial Committee will assist the department in organizing an occupational analysis with industry experts, a key step in program development. The first seafarer SSVD cohort is expected to start at the Centre de formation de Saint-Romuald (Institut maritime du Québec) in September 2017.
