

EMPLOI-QUÉBEC FUNDING

Emploi-Québec offers financial assistance to candidates required to take regulatory maritime training given at the Institut maritime du Québec's Centre de formation aux mesures d'urgence (CFMU), in Lévis. This funding is granted to maritime companies financing the training of individuals they intend to hire as navigating personnel. The companies must refer the candidates to be trained. For the candidates deemed eligible, this funding covers 100% of the cost of regulatory training (certain eligibility criteria apply).

Companies that received Emploi-Québec funding under the current budget have until November 1st to reserve their places using the amounts allocated to them for training scheduled on the CFMU timetable until March 31, 2022. After November 1st, any funding not used by these companies will become available to all Québec maritime companies with navigating personnel.

MINISTÈRE DES TRANSPORTS DU QUÉBEC FUNDING

We would like to remind you that the Ministère des Transports du Québec (MTQ) offers funding slated for the professional development of seafarers wishing to obtain initial or advanced navigating or mechanical engineering certification. This funding can cover up to 50% of training costs. Holders of certification issued in another country, who are in the process of converting their papers to obtain Canadian certification, are also eligible (certain eligibility criteria apply).
