APRIL AND FUNDING FOR MARINE-SECTOR TRAINING

April 1 marks the beginning of a new year for marine-sector navigating personnel training funding. Emploi-Québec has confirmed a total budget envelope of \$200 000, as in past years, for our sector. Marine-sector companies whose (future) employees require regulated training to go back to work on ships are eligible. Companies must identify the candidates targeted by the financial assistance and candidates must meet Emploi-Québec eligibility criteria.

April 1 is also the date that candidates taking courses leading to officer certification can obtain financial assistance from the Ministère des Transports du Québec. This funding had not been available since last November because the \$60 000 granted annually had already been used. Individuals sign up for these training sessions and must apply to the Institut maritime for financial assistance when they register.
