Québec's 2015 budget: Maritime Strategy and training

On March 26, Finance Minister Carlos Leitao tabled Québec's 2015-2016 budget on behalf of his Government. Many provisions affect human resources, including raising the annual pay threshold to \$2 million for requiring companies to spend 1% on human resources training or pay into the Workforce Skills Development and Recognition Fund. The budget accords significant importance to matching training with jobs, notably by adopting measures promoting onthe-job training. The Minister also announced measures designed to support the Québec Maritime Strategy's implementation—an estimated \$1.5 billion over the next five years. Marine-sector training was not forgotten, with \$15 million being earmarked over the next five years to support trades and training activities in the marine economy. The details of this initiative will be announced in June when the Maritime Strategy is released.
