Susan Falkner, Sectorial Committee Training Coordinator, also reported on the workshop at the Regional Marine Advisory Council (RMAC) meeting on March 15 at the Clarion hotel in Québec City. Her presentation provided an opportunity to share the results of the Marine Personnel Regulations Workshop and to inform the participants of the requests and questions that were addressed to the representatives of Transport Canada at the event.

GENERAL SHIPPING KNOWLEDGE TRAINING: A GREAT SUCCESS!

The March 8 edition of the training session on general shipping knowledge, held at the Maison de l'UPA in Longueuil, was a rousing success with almost 20 participants.

Among the subjects discussed by trainer Nicolas Parent, Senior Consultant with CPCS, were: introduction to shipping and the marine transport context, major shipping industry stakeholders, related trades, types of vessels navigating the St. Lawrence and overall shipping system organization (legislation, regulations).

Two guest speakers were on hand to talk about more specific marine-sector topics. Daniel Olivier, of the Montréal Port Authority, presented his organization and the Port of Montréal in general. Then, Geneviève Gauthier, of Logistec Corporation, spoke about the field of stevedoring in relation to her company, its history and innovations.
