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A REMINDER FOR THE FINAN-CIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM THAT ENCOURAGES CAREER **ADVANCEMENT AMONG OFFICERS**

There is a financial assistance program slated for seamen's professional development offered by the Ministère des Transports du Québec (MTQ). The program is managed by the Human Resources Sectorial Committee of the Maritime Industry (CSMOIM) and the Institut maritime du Québec (IMQ).

After concluding agreement with CSMOIM in fall 2013, the MTQ confirmed that this measure was renewed.

This funding pays up to 50% of eligible candidates' costs for training leading to Navigation Officer or Marine Engineer certificates. Candidates holding certificates issued in another country, who are in the conversion process to obtain Canadian certificates, may also apply for this financial assistance.

To benefit from this funding, candidates must fill out an application for it with the Institut maritime du Québec's Centre de formation aux mesures d'urgence en mer (CFMU).

TRAINING NEEDS SURVEY: **FOLLOW-UP ON PLACES AWARDED**

To follow up on the training needs survey, we would like to inform you that the Centre de formation aux mesures d'urgence (CFMU) sent maritime organizations information concerning their requests for financial assistance in November.

We would ask the companies receiving funding to register their eligible candidates as soon as possible to save their spots and maintain the funding available. Given that the training sessions have a maximum capacity and that some are offered only once a year, it is essential that candidates be registered as soon as possible.

After January 8, 2016, unused funding will become available to all marine-sector companies with eligible candidates and having completed the training needs

EXPERT SEAMEN SOUGHT FOR OCCUPATIONAL ANA-**LYSIS**

In June 2015, in the wake of the unveiling of the Québec Maritime Strategy, the Québec government announced the development of a new marine-sector training program: a vocational studies diploma (DEP) in seamanship. The preparatory work is already under way and one of the essential steps for developing the DEP is the occupational analysis. This involves a systematic inventory of all of the duties, tasks and operations seamen carry out in order to arrive at a structured whole that will be used to develop the program of study.

This is done with the help of a dozen experts in the field during a two-day, intensive brainstorming session. The occupational analysis will take place on January 13-14, 2016 in Québec City under the responsibility of the Ministère de l'Éducation. We are looking for seamen with experience on deck and in the engine room to take part in this activity. Travel and accommodation expenses are covered and participants receive salary compensation.
