## MARINE PERSONNEL REGULATIONS WORKSHOP: FEBRUARY 20, 2019

With February looming on the horizon, the Sectorial Committee is pleased to announce the return of the Marine Personnel Regulations Workshop!

Following the event's annual success, the Sectorial Committee is once again bringing all marine industry stakeholders together to discuss the issues and regulatory requirements governing navigating personnel training and certification. Note that the workshop will run again this year at Hôtel Québec (3115, avenue des Hôtels, Québec, QC, G1W 3Z6).

In keeping with the same formula as in past years, the Sectorial Committee has reached an agreement with Transport Canada for the main Marine Personnel Regulations-related elements raised in the workshop to be presented at the Regional Marine Advisory Council (RMAC) meeting to be held in March in Québec City. Under this agreement, Transport Canada representatives in Québec will also ensure that, again this year, workshop participants' questions and concerns are forwarded to Transport Canada marine regulatory authorities in Ottawa for appropriate follow-up.

The Marine Personnel Regulations Workshop agenda will be sent to participants before the event.

### SEVERAL SUCCESSFUL GENERAL SHIPPING KNOWLEDGE TRAINING SESSIONS IN RECENT MONTHS!

For the first time since the inception of our in-house training session *General Shipping Knowledge*, which initiates new marine-sector employees to the industry, the training ran in Mont-Joli. Here, on November 22, 2018, 28 participants from the Maurice Lamontagne Institute learned more about the marine industry and its stakeholders.

Given by Nicolas Parent, Senior Consultant with CPCS, the training session also featured short presentations on two Québec maritime organizations. Noémie Giguère, Technopole maritime du Québec, and Jerry Young, Innovation maritime, spoke to participants about their respective organizations' missions and projects.

The training was repeated in Longueuil on November 28, initiating another 20 individuals to the marine industry. This time, the guest speakers were Daniel Olivier, Port of Montréal, and Éric Sauvé, Corporation des pilotes du Saint-Laurent Central.
