IMPORTANT REMINDER CONCERNING EMPLOI-QUEBEC FINANCIAL AS-SISTANCE FOR MARINE-SECTOR REGULATED **TRAINING**

To follow up on the training needs survey conducted in fall 2015, funded spots were awarded to marinesector companies until January 8, 2016 under Emploi-Québec's financial assistance program for marinesector regulated training.

As of this date, unused funding has become available to any marinesector company with eligible candidates. Currently, \$24 500 of the financial assistance awarded by Emploi-Québec remains.

Companies must contact the IMQ (Institut maritime du Québec) directly to register their participants. In collaboration with the IMQ, applications will be processed on a first come, first serve basis in keeping with the Sectorial Committee's criteria of fairness and effectiveness.

MARINE PERSONNEL REGULATIONS WORKSHOP HIGHLY SUC-**CESSFUL IN OUÉBEC CITY!**

This year's Marine Personnel Regulations workshop, held on February 17, was another rousing success, attracting some 70 participants.

The workshop broached a wide range of subjects. Annie Larouche and Denis Bélanger, Transport Canada Marine Safety and Security Inspectors, addressed the industry's requests expressed at last year's workshop, namely: the Small Vessel Operator SVO (CPB) certificate, the Master 3000 Gross tonnage, Domestic certificate, the hours of work / hours of rest question, and safety management systems.

The 2010 STCW Convention amendments and the process and deadline for adopting the new Marine Personnel Regulations were also discussed. A presentation was also given on the September 2015 marine safety bulletin on how to meet STCW Manila 2010 rules. The Transport Canada representatives also took the time to answer the maritime industry's questions concerning the delays involved in issuing medical certificates and recognizing officer cadets' sea time.

Finally, Claude Mailloux, Executive Director of the Human Resources Sectorial Committee of the Maritime Industry (CSMOIM), outlined developments in the proposed new program of studies for a DEP (secondary school vocational diploma) in seamanship.

To follow up on this meeting, the Sectorial Committee, in collaboration with Transport Canada, will present a report incorporating participants' questions and concerns at the March 9 Regional Marine Advisory Council meeting. And, watch for the upcoming publication of a regulations column on the themes addressed at the workshop.

The Sectorial Committee thanks its_partners—CTMA, Canada Steamship Lines, Ocean Group, Oceanex and, of course, Transport Canada—for their collaboration and support in organizing this unique opportunity to rally marine industry stakeholders around the regulatory issues and requirements affecting navigating personnel training and certification. A special thanks to Denis Bélanger, Annie Larouche, Bernard Leclerc and Lisa Arsenault from the Transport Canada team in Rimouski for their outstanding contribution to the day's success!

SECTORIAL COMMITTEE IN PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE HEARINGS

On February 9, the Sectorial Committee's Executive Director, Claude Mailloux, and SODES President, Nicole Trépanier, were invited to present the content of a brief on immigration tabled in 2015 before the members of the Committee on Citizen Relations.

SODES and the Sectorial Committee pointed out how important it is that Bill 77 (Québec Immigration Act) help remove the obstacles that prevent permanent immigrants with marine qualifications from coming to Canada, particularly since they can help solve the hiring challenges experienced by the maritime industry.

Québec's Minister of Immigration, Diversity and Inclusiveness, Kathleen Weil, was in attendance and participated actively in the discussions that followed presentation of the brief.

GENERAL SHIPPING KNOWLEDGE TRAINING BACK IN QUÉBEC CITY IN 2016!

At the industry's express request, the Sectorial Committee, in collaboration with Innovation maritime, will offer a day-long training session on shipping on April 7 in Québec City.
