THE SEAFARER'S DISCHARGE BOOK: WHAT IS IT USED FOR?

What is a seafarer's discharge book?

The discharge book is a Canadian maritime booklet that takes the form of a small wallet containing the Canadian seafarer's information. Every Canadian seafarer must have one.

Before getting a discharge book, a seafarer must have a **Candidate document number (CDN)**. The CDN is issued by Transport Canada (TC) and is a seafarer's identification number.

Here is the simplified process to get a <u>CDN</u>.

Once the seafarer has a CDN, they need to make an appointment with TC to get their **discharge book**. Proof of employment or enrollment in an approved training institution may be required. Find contact information for the Transport Canada-Marine Safety office in your area <u>here</u>.

The discharge book contains the seafarer's personal information and his CDN. The discharge book is used to record details of sea time. It is not a passport, nor a travel document.

Immigrants wishing to have their foreign certificates recognized and wishing to work in Canada in navigation or marine engineering must have a discharge book. They must therefore be Canadian citizens or permanent residents.
