GUIDANCE COUNSELLORS' DAY

February 8 the CSMOIM gave a workshop for guidance counsellors in the greater Montréal area, designed to introduce them to career opportunities in the maritime sector. The activity included a presentation on the maritime sector and its occupations. Then, an Institut maritime du Québec representative explained IMQ's mission and the training available in this establishment, the only one of its kind in Québec!

Finally, a seaman, longshorewoman and marine pilot live from on board ship took turns talking about their respective careers to the more than 60 counsellors in attendance. Following the activity, the Sectorial Committee asked participants to complete a survey and 100% of them answered that they would recommend the event to other guidance counsellors!

Note that the number of spots for this training session is limited and that the COVID-19 rules in effect will be applied.



CSMOIM TO SIT ON MON SAINT-LAURENT INSPIRANT CONTEST JURY

This year, CSMOIM will sit on the jury of the Monique Fitz-Back foundation's Mon Saint-Laurent inspirant contest, which awards prizes to students who submitted a work of art or text before March 1. The winners will be announced in early April 2022.

SERVICES QUÉBEC FUNDING FOR MARITIME SECTOR TRAINING

Some 27 companies, among those that completed the survey form, identified the need for funding for regulatory maritime training. The amount requested by respondents exceeded \$1 000 000.00. After compiling the results, the Sectorial Committee, working with the Institut maritime du Québec's Centre de formation aux mesures d'urgences (CFMU), divided up the funding available for financial assistance, namely \$200 000. Services Québec funding is allocated based on requests made at the survey stage, applying strict criteria based on effectiveness and equity between companies.

After the funding was divided up, companies received letters indicating the amount of financial assistance allocated to them. The period for using these amounts is for training given between April 1, 2022 and March 31, 2023. Any amounts not used by November 11, 2022 will become available for all Québec maritime sector companies until the funding runs out for use on training dispensed before March 31, 2023. Maritime companies that answered the training needs survey will have priority in accessing any remaining funding. The survey is also essential for adapting CFMU training to industry needs
