


MPR WORKSHOP

REVIEW AND ACTION POINTS ON SEA-BASED INTERNSHIPS

On September 26, 2025, the CSMOIM Board of Directors raised several issues related to sea-based internships, particularly in terms of attractiveness, retention, and logistics. Given that internships are an essential step in student's careers and that they are governed by specific regulations, an ad hoc committee was created to analyze current practices and propose areas for improvement.

As a result, and with the labor market evolving rapidly, the IMQ wishes to modernize its approaches and strengthen collaboration between the various players in the industry.

The committee met 4 times to examine the challenges faced by both the IMQ and shipowners, and then to formulate recommendations aimed at optimizing access to internships, their management, and the overall experience of interns.

Over the coming months, this work will lead to the implementation of concrete actions in line with the recommendations made.

This training, offered in collaboration with the Centres de services scolaire des Navigateurs et des Chics-Chocs, the Centre de formation Charlevoix (AVISE), the Eastern Shores School Board, and Services aux entreprises des Rives-du-Saguenay (Projet Compétences), represents a significant step forward for the entire maritime sector. Carried out in partnership with PERFORM and made possible thanks to financial support from the Ministère de l'Emploi et de la Solidarité sociale, this initiative marks a decisive step in meeting the growing needs of the industry, in addition to filling a major gap in diploma-level training leading to a career as a shipbuilder in Quebec.
