SERVICES QUÉBEC REGULATORY TRAINING FUNDING

Annual Services Québec funding is still available for maritime companies who completed the annual survey last February.

If you were granted funding and have not yet used the amounts available earmarked for your company, you have until November 11 to do so.

After that, unused funding will be made available to all Québec maritime companies.

MINISTÈRE DES TRANSPORTS DU QUÉBEC (MTQ) FINANCIAL

ASSISTANCE MEASURES

Just a quick reminder that the Ministère des Transports du Québec offers funding for the professional development of seafarers wishing to obtain initial or advanced Navigation or Mechanical Engineering certification. This funding covers 50% of training costs. Holders of certification issued in another country, who are in the process of converting their papers to obtain Canadian certification, are also eligible for this financial assistance (certain eligibility criteria apply).
