FIRST-EVER ASSISES QUÉBÉCOISES DU SECTEUR MARITIME: SUCCESSFUL ACROSS THE BOARD!

The first-ever Assises québécoises du secteur maritime (Québec maritime sector congress) took place on May 28, 2021. This virtual event allowed more than 350 maritime sector stakeholders to lay the groundwork for reflection on four main themes:

- Infrastructures, logistics and the smart corridor
- Economic recovery and exporting
- Environmental protection, biodiversity and research
- Human resources and training.

The Sectorial Committee is proud to have presented and facilitated the day's fourth workshop: Human resources and training. In the workshop, three panellists – Québec Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity Jean Boulet, Institut maritime du Québec Director Mélanie Leblanc and Transports Desgagnés inc. President and General Manager Serge Le Guellec - looked at understanding current and future human resources training-related issues, sharing best practices and identifying potential solutions for action.

Discussions were productive and highly relevant for our industry. The Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity confirmed the Government's intention to reactivate the Table de concertation en adéquation formation emploi (roundtable on matching training to employment) to address maritime industry human resources' issues. Federal Transport Minister the Honourable Omar Alghabra also confirmed that Transport Canada would take part in this roundtable's work.

The Sectorial Committee wishes to thank the event's presenting partners: the St. Lawrence Economic Development Council (SODES), Green Marine, St. Lawrence Shipoperators and Québec Minister for Transport Chantal Rouleau. Thanks also to the day's official presenter, the Fonds de solidarité FTQ.
