## **TRAINING NEEDS SURVEY: NEW FORMULA AS OF 2021**

This fall, the Sectorial Committee and the IMQ's Centre de formation aux mesures d'urgence (Emergency measures training centre - CFMU) did not reallocate remaining funding since an analysis of the requests made in the survey confirmed that the April 2020 distribution still applies. Given the exceptional situation surrounding the pandemic, the spots offered in the fall training sessions were soon filled due to the classes' capacity constraints and the safety measures that needed to be taken. Unfortunately, not all companies were able to enroll their personnel in the training sessions available.

We therefore invite maritime companies to use the amounts granted them last April for CFMU training by consulting the <u>training calendar</u>. Note that this year, the Sectorial Committee and the CFMU decided that unused amounts for the current fiscal year will become available to all Québec maritime companies on November 27, 2020 (for new inscriptions only).

A regulated training and funding needs update, for the year beginning next April 1, will be proposed once the new financial assistance budget has been confirmed by Emploi-Québec, probably in March 2021.

Remember that it is still possible to obtain Ministère des Transports du Québec (MTQ) funding for career advancement. Click <u>here</u> for further information on this subject.
