CARGO INSPECTOR



Main duties and responsibilities

The cargo inspector is responsible for inspecting the cargo transported aboard ships. Depending on his/her specialty, he/she may be put in charge of visual observation of tanks, volume and temperature measurements, sampling cargo or counting packages loaded and unloaded. He/she prepares the documentation, reports and manifests attesting to the quantity and quality of the cargo. He/she communicates frequently with the port terminals, the ship personnel and the customer to inform them of the progress of the inspection operations.

Educational or occupational background

On-the-job training is usually offered.

A college diploma in navigation or experience in cargo transshipment by sea is an advantage.

Knowledge of English is essential.
