



MARINE SECURITY SPECIALIST

Main duties and responsibilities

The marine security specialist ensures that his/her organization's activities conform to the marine security regulatory standards in force. He/she participates in the development of policies and procedures, performs risk and vulnerability assessments of his/her company's operations, prepares and implements security plans, and plans and coordinates the annual inspections and drills. He/she is also responsible for training and raising employee awareness in marine security.

The marine security inspector ensures that the vessels and the port terminals and their operations conform to the standards and regulations in force.

Educational or occupational background

A college or university certificate in a field associated with conflict management, law or civil protection may be requested.

A college diploma in navigation or experience in the shipping field is an advantage.

The Institut maritime du Québec à Rimouski offers the college program in navigation.
