



MARINE TRANSPORT ANALYST

Main duties and responsibilities

The shipping analyst collects, analyzes and interprets data regarding marine transportation of passengers and cargo, port management and transportation planning. He/she issues notices or recommendations to the authority to which he/she reports with a view to decision-making. He/she collaborates in the preparation, implementation and evaluation of various assistance programs for the industry.

He/she participates in the drafting of legislation and regulations, policies, orientation documents and strategic planning. He/she contributes to research, studies and sector committees, as needed.

A Bachelor's or Master's degree in transportation, economics, statistics, geography, land use planning and regional development, urban planning, environment or another discipline deemed relevant..
